


## **Integrated Settlement Support**

With settlement workers available at all our LINC sites, students are encouraged to see our counsellors and to take part in all of our settlement and integration programming geared towards newcomers. As well, community organizations / institutions are invited to provide presentations in LINC classrooms to familiarize students with the resources available. Field trips to points of interest in the City of Toronto have always been welcomed as an effective learning tool. With the aim of providing well rounded support to our LINC students, settlement workers are scheduled to meet with all new LINC students for a needs assessment.

# Other English Learning Activities


In a long-standing community partnership with the Toronto Catholic District School Board, our unit takes an active part in referring clients to ESL / Citizenship programs to meet their specific needs. In view of the rising demand for citizenship preparation, we partner with our agency's Library Settlement Program and Toronto Public Library in running a series of citizenship classes at Bridlewood Library.



## **LINC Support Services**

To facilitate accessibility of services to learners, we operate a childminding program for children aged 18 months to 6 years for parents during class hours. Students in need are also given transportation assistance upon approval of their application. To elevate the quality of teaching, computer laboratories are set up at the Sheppard and Midland sites to make teaching more interactive and in tune with the times.

#### **LINC-Toronto Program Highlights**

#### **LINC Student Activities**

Health Talks: With the help of community partners such as The Scarborough Centre for Healthy Communities (SCHC), our students gained insights into how to eat healthily and shop for healthy food; OHIP coverage and how to access health & community Services; stress management; how to handle medical problems; Ontario drug benefits for seniors and free dental services, etc. The annual flu clinic offered by SCHC was again well attended by our students and their families.

**Immigrant Salon Series:** This workshop series operated by our Settlement and Integration staff provided information on the education system for both adults and children; an understanding of financial issues and how to plan for the future, including RRSP and credit building.

**Field Trips:** As always, field trips figured prominently in the popularity list of our students. A variety of trips were organized in 2011 to augment the curriculum and to introduce new immigrants to the culture and heritage that makes Canada unique: Spadina House; City Tours to Downtown Toronto; Metro Toronto Zoo; Richmond Green Park & Forsyth Family Farm; Royal Ontario Museum; Bata Shoe Museum, as well as neighbourhood supermarkets, libraries and pharmacies to provide practical experiences in conversation skills.

The student surveys conducted in 2011 revealed a high satisfaction rate with the contents and quality of our LINC program.

- Has gained better understanding about Canada: 98.5%
- ◆ The class helps you start a new life in Canada: 98.5%
- Feel more comfortable using English in daily life: 98.5%
- ◆ Would recommend our LINC classes to other people: 97.7%

Additional comments on CICS services as a whole were likewise positive as illustrated below: more community services: 99.2%

- ◆ Support the idea of increased government funding for CICS services: 96.4%
  - ◆ The students also expressed a keen interest in learning more about the range of CICS programs and services besides language training.

# **Childminding Services**

At our three LINC program sites in Scarborough, childminding services are offered to the children of LINC students aged between 18 months and 6 years. Our team of experienced childminding staff offer structured programming and a cozy learning environment to help children develop their social, cognitive and language skills. By using a variety of games and educational activities, children have a chance to build up their confidence and learn how to communicate with others. The young participants in our LINC childminding program also have the opportunity to get to know children from different ethnic backgrounds and get to know one another.

# **Skills Development Projects**

In 2011, with the help of volunteer facilitators, we were able to offer a number of skills development sessions to broaden our students' understanding about living in Canada. Offered outside of LINC training hours, these sessions covered a variety of areas including language and computer skills upgrading, employment, understanding the environment and promotion of general well-being.

- Learning English through guitar playing
- Pronunciation and Effective Communication with a focus on accent reduction and common errors in pronunciation
  - Basic Drawing
  - ◆ Sessions on the Environment and Health offered in conjunction with "Live Green Toronto"
  - Basic employment information for lower level LINC students
  - Basic computer operation (sending/receiving emails; information search on the Internet)
  - Accessing information and services on the Internet and social media
  - Practical Excel skills

# MARKHAM SOUTH WELCOME CENTRE



- Full time Language Classes at MSWC began in January of 2011
- ♦ Open House event in February drew over 300 people
- In March we hosted a South Asian Community Consultation, bringing together key community leaders from the South Asian Communities to discuss ways the Welcome Centre can serve their needs. The committee continued to meet thereafter.
- In April we celebrated the Tamil New Year with a community event with 200 people attend from various South Asian communities
- In May we hosted an outdoor Festival celebrating Asian Heritage Month and drew over 400 people and 35 agencies from the community

- ◆ In June we co-hosted an event with IBM Canada celebrating their 100th anniversary. Their HR department staff donated their time to meet with jobseekers interested in the IT field to share advice and consultation at the welcome centre.
- In June we began offering on site language assessment for York Region clients
- In December MSWC hosted a large Job Fair with T&T Supermarkets, as well as an Christmas celebration attended by over 200 clients.
- ◆ In January 2012, in collaboration with the York Region District School Board, we began offering ESL classes in the evening.






